## How to Find Us

**Royal Windsor Racecourse** has excellent access to most major motorway networks and rail services.

### By road

---

Windsor Racecourse is on the main A308 between Windsor and Maidenhead. From the M4 leave at junction 6 and follow the signs to Windsor.

From the M3 leave at junction 2 to join the M25 and travel North towards Heathrow. Leave the M25 at junction 15 and join the M4 (West) to junction 6 as above.

If travelling to the racecourse from the West it is very often better to leave the M4 at Junction 8/9, follow the dual carriageway directing you towards Maidenhead Centre, and then take the A308 towards Windsor. Entrance to the racecourse can then be achieved by turning left into the Racecourse Yacht Basin road and following signs into the racecourse infrastructure after that.

### Travel from London

---

#### Bus services

The 'GREENLINE' bus service operates direct from Victoria in London to Windsor and on to Legoland and Bracknell. Click here for Greenline buses. Check for Scheduled Services for 700/701/702. There are a variety of stops at which you can catch the bus in London but beware, there are two places in Victoria where buses leave from. The Colonnades is a shopping centre in Victoria. It is opposite Victoria Coach Station, on Buckingham Palace Rd. 'Greenline' have stops in front and behind the Colonnades building.

The most convenient stop in central Windsor is at the Parish Church. This is right by the castle. The bus continues on to Legoland after calling in Windsor.

#### Train services

There are frequent British Rail services from Waterloo to Windsor and Eton Riverside directly. (50-55 minutes). The quickest way to Windsor from London is via Paddington to Slough (22 mins) where you change for Windsor. (Platform 1).

From both stations head for Barry Avenue Promenade on the Thames and catch the Riverbus to the racecourse. French Brother's Riverbus service operates from Barry Avenue Promenade close to Eton Bridge in the town centre. This is directly opposite Browns restaurant. The river trip takes about ten minutes and the service runs back to the town centre after racing. French Brothers can be contacted on 01753 851900 / 862933. Except on quiet days (or if it is close to the time the course opens) it is generally quicker and cheaper to get from anywhere in Windsor Town Centre by River Bus rather than by taxi.

### Travel from Heathrow - Taxi, Train and Bus services

---

#### Train

There is not a direct train service from Heathrow to Windsor but there are two indirect train services. The first is the Heathrow Express to Paddington (expensive) and then to Windsor via Slough as above.

The second is a coach link to Feltham Station where you will be able to connect with the Waterloo - Windsor Riverside service.

## Bus

Bus services from the Bus and Coach Station in the centre of Heathrow are few and far between, but there is a service from Heathrow to Windsor via Slough and a service operated by BAA and First Beeline direct to Windsor via Datchet. The service departs from the bus station in Heathrow's Central Area every half hour..

## Travel to and from Gatwick

---

Gatwick Airport is some distance from Windsor, to the south of London whereas Windsor is to the west. The journey time by car is therefore around one hour (50 miles). Gatwick Airport to M23 [TRAFFIC Info - Tel 401100], M25 signposted Heathrow then join the M4 motorway, signposted The West and Slough, then A355, signposted Windsor. You could leave the M25 at Staines (before reaching the M4) and take the road to Windsor via Old Windsor, passing through Magna Carta country at Runnymede.

Taxi fare to Windsor is around £50 (October 2006).

If you need to use public transport I suggest the following route by train which should take around two hours.

**Gatwick Airport** by train to **Clapham Junction**, **change and by** train to **Windsor & Eton Riverside**. **National Rail** Enquiries <http://www.nationalrail.co.uk/>

## Travel to and from Stansted

---

Stansted Airport is some distance from Windsor, to the north and east of London whereas Windsor is to the west.

The journey time by car is therefore well over one hour and involves using the M11 motorway towards London, then the M25 anti-clockwise and the M4 west to Slough and Windsor. If you need to use public transport I suggest the following route by train which should take around two hours.

The AA provide an excellent Route Planner service here. Taxi fare to Windsor is around £80 (October 2006).

Stansted Airport by train to London Liverpool Street then by Underground or taxi to London Paddington then by train to Slough and change to train for Windsor & Eton Central. For detailed information and ticket prices National Rail Enquiries <http://www.nationalrail.co.uk/>

**From the North; M25, London Orbital**

- Exit the motorway at junction 15 onto the M4, (junction 4B) and follow The West, Slough, Reading.
- Continue to exit at junction 6, signposted for Slough (Central), Windsor (A332), Eton, and the A355 and take the A332 to Windsor.
- Exit the A332 for the A308, and Windsor Racecourse and at the roundabout at the end of the slip road, take the 3rd exit onto the A308, towards Maidenhead.

**From The South**

- Exit the M3 motorway at junction 3, signposted for Woking, Bracknell, Lightwater, and the A332.
- Take the A332 off the roundabout and continue on this road into Windsor for approximately 6-8 miles.
- Just east of Windsor town centre, continue left at the next roundabout into Osborne Road, continuing into the lower part of Frances Road and then into Alma Road.
- Join Goslar Way, (A308) to the large roundabout and take the 3rd exit off this roundabout onto the A332.
- Take the next exit off the A332 immediately after this roundabout and at the roundabout at the end of the slip road, turn left onto Maidenhead Road, A308, the entrance to the racecourse is on the right-hand side.

**From Maidenhead**

- Exit Maidenhead joining the A308 towards Windsor.
- At the roundabout junction with the A308(M) continue ahead.
- At the next roundabout continue straight ahead onto Maidenhead Rd
- Continue to just pass the junction with the B3025, the entrance to the racecourse is on the left-hand side.

**By Train**

- The nearest stations are Windsor and Eton Central Station and Windsor and Eton Riverside Station.
- There are taxis available from outside both stations.

**By Boat**

- French Brothers shuttle services operates from Barry Avenue Promenade, close to Windsor Bridge in the town centre. The river trip takes about 10 minutes. The Service runs back to the town centre after racing. For Further information please ring 01753 851 900
